Specific Beef Department Rules are as follows:

No cattle or tack allowed in barns prior to 12 noon on Wednesday, July 21.

All animals to be on grounds by 10:00p.m., Wednesday, July 21, released at conclusion of awards program on Friday. Steer will be weighed and mouthed at 11: a.m., the day of the showing. Steers may be mouthed in accordance with State Fair rules. STEERS SHOWN BY BREEDS

All animals showing in group classes must show in single class. We reserve the right to combine classes if there is only one exhibitor in a class.

All animals must be tattooed and registered in respective breeds, including animals entered in "All Other Breeds".

All animals must be stalled in the barns, overflow of cattle will be stalled in hog barns

No "butt" fans will be allowed.

All breeding cattle must be at least 50% of stated breed or shown in all other breeds. State Fair guidelines will be followed for steers and breeding cattle as per registration show requirements and percentages.

All exhibitors must present premise ID number at time of entry.

Generators allowed in approved areas only.

Points Show: IBA rules will be followed.

Herdsman Award Beef Barn: \$10 cash award given by Macoupin County Fair; judging based principally on neatness and appearance of stall or pens, also timeliness of getting livestock to show ring and presenting livestock.

All ethics rules will follow state fair guidelines.

No chute in Hog Barn.

All wire, cans, bottles, and **garbage** shall be placed in containers. All show boxes, feed and cots must be kept in area of individual stalls and out of show ring.

** All exhibitors will be required to display their exhibitor number – on their back, their belt or show harness**
